Diagnoses in the second quarter

1 April - 30 June 1997

- A total of 162 diagnoses of HIV infection, 51 diagnoses of AIDS and 34 deaths following AIDS were reported, by 30 September 1997, to have occurred in the second quarter of 1997.
- Following adjustment for reporting delay, the estimated numbers of AIDS diagnoses and deaths following AIDS occurring in the second quarter of 1997 were 114 and 86, respectively.
- In comparison, 214 diagnoses of HIV infection, 149 diagnoses of AIDS and 113 deaths following AIDS were reported, by 30 September 1997, to have occurred in the second quarter of 1996.

Diagnoses in the year to 30 June 1997

- 814 diagnoses of HIV infection
- 360 diagnoses of AIDS
- 285 deaths following AIDS
 were reported by 30 September 1997.

Total diagnoses to 30 June 1997

- · 20,706 diagnoses of HIV infection
- 16,500 diagnoses of HIV infection following adjustment for multiple reporting
- 7,460 diagnoses of AIDS
- 5,370 deaths following AIDS were reported by 30 September 1997.

HIV Testing in Sexual Health Clinics

Five sexual health clinics in Adelaide, Brisbane, Darwin, Melbourne and Sydney tested 5,750 people in the period 1 April to 30 June 1997 who were not previously known to have HIV infection.

- Of 2,343 people reported as having been tested for the first time, 12 (0.5%) were found to have HIV infection.
- Of 3,241 people reported as having been retested following a previous negative test, 4 (0.1%) were found to have HIV infection.
- Of 1,621 people who reported a history of heterosexual contact only in Australia and who were tested for HIV antibody for the first time, 3 (0.2%) were newly diagnosed with HIV infection.

HIV diagnoses

People diagnosed with HIV infection in the year to 30 June 1997 had an average age of 36 years, and 1.0% were in the age group 13 – 19 years. 91% were male, 7% were female and sex was not reported for 2% of cases.


Of the 82% of cases of HIV infection newly diagnosed in the year to 30 June 1997 for which exposure to HIV was recorded,17% reported a history of heterosexual contact only.

New HIV infections

During the second quarter of 1997, 35 cases were reported as having newly acquired HIV infection, identified by a negative test within the 12 months prior to diagnosis or the diagnosis of HIV seroconversion illness. Exposure to HIV was attributed to heterosexual contact only in 9% of cases.
